

### PARK BEACH SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT AND FINANCIAL STATEMENT.

Gentlemen,

It is my pleasure to present to you this report detailing the activities of the Park Beach Surf Life Saving Club during 1963-64.

#### Patrols and Lifesaving

By the maintenance of patrols, and by the vigilance and service of all members, <u>no</u> lives were lost on Park Beach during the season.

The Club Captain Brian Foley, and Club Vice-Captain Chris. Guesdon are to be congratulated on maintaining the high standard of all patrols.

Two rescues were performed by members during the season. One with the surf boat and one without the use of gear. Had our members not been present both incidents could have resulted in fatalities.

The fact that our Club was placed second in the State-wide B.P. patrol efficiency competition must also speak volumes for the present standard of our patrols.

#### First-Aid

Much time, effort and money has been spent by the Club in equiping, and maintaining this vital public service. During the season 37 cases of first-aid were recorded.

Several members have qualified for the St. Johns First-Aid Certificate. It is to be hoped that more members will follow suit.

#### The Club House:

This remained virtually unchanged during the season. However Kitchen facilities have seen a marked improvement. Thanks must be extended to those members who fitted two new tanks at the rear of the Club House. Also, without the assistance of the Club plumbers, Chris Woodward and Tony Priest, we would not now enjoy hot and cold water in the Kitchen.

During the winter members constructed a concrete floor in the boat shed. This was a major task and our gratitude must be expressed to all those who spent two solid weekends on the job.

The gear room has now been completly sealed off from the rest of the clubhouse and affords complete security for our gear.

#### Competition:

#### Australian Championships:

Fourteen members attended the Collaroy Carnivals held on the 28th and 29th of March 1964. While no Park Beach member, or team, was suvvessful, we were represented in many events. Perhaps the member who sampled the services of the demonstration "motorized" surf boat during the afternoon will be able to provide us with some first hand information on this subject.

A word of thanks to the President and members of South Narrabeen Surf Lifesaving Club for the hospitality shown to our members during their stay in Sydney.

#### Park Beach Carnival

This was held on Sunday 12th of January 1964 in almost ideal weather conditions. A crowd officially estimated at 3,000 was present.

All members co-operated wholeheartedly in preparing for the carnival, with the Organiser, Eoin McDonald whose experience proved to be an important factor in the unqualified success achieved. At the conclusion of the day, a senior member of the board of examiners stated that "the carnival left nothing to be desired".

#### B P Boat Competition

Our second placing in the patrol efficiency competition indicates that our patrols have now reached the highest standard ever. With a greater effort next season, the B P Boat could be ours.

#### Fund Raising

Funds came from three main sources during the season.

#### Button Day

Button Day yielded a good return thanks to the members who gave up their time to sell buttons. I hope more members will be seen selling next year.

#### The Hobart Regatta Stall

This undertaking was a shining example of the club spirit growing at Park Beach. The Stall was manned for two days by most of our members in turn. The weather during the second day could only be described as "shocking". Conditions were not made any more pleasant by the presence of two large pools on the canvas roof. These, at one stage threatened to demolish the complete construction. Never-the-less the work continued. A special mention must be made of the fine efforts of Terry Properjohn and Wayne Cannon in the organisation and supervision of the whole venture.

#### Club Captains Report

In conclusion I would like to thank all club members for their co-operation shown throughout the year and may I express my hope that the coming season will be even more successful than the previous one.
