PARK BEACH SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB SIXTH ANNUAL
REPORT AND FINANCIAL STATEMENT.

Gentlemen,

Once again I take pleasure in presenting the Annual Report of the Park Beach Surf Life Saving Club.

Let us bear in mind, as the year 1964-65 is reviewed, that our Club may no longer be described as young and inexperienced. During the past six years it has developed into a mature organization performing a vitally important public service.

Many problems have been faced and surmounted in this period. Perhaps the major problem has been the change in the surfing habits of the public. We must now realise that young men, who enjoy surfing, are no longer inevitably drawn to the surf life saving movement. To-day they must be recruited.

One pleasing result of these changes is that the undisciplined and un-cooperative individual no longer feels disposed to make the sacrifices entailed in the membership of a surf life saving club. He is, therefore, attracted to other less responsible surfing activities.

The past year has been one of growth and consolidation. The Club successfully undertook the major task of organizing the Tasmanian Surf Life Saving Championships. Significant increases occurred in both junior membership and in the number of awards gained.

For the first time two members who received their Bronze Medallions as Park Beach members have passed through our ranks to attain the status of Examiners.

When assessed the events of the year illustrate graphically the vitality, enthusiasm and dedication of the young men who compose the Park Beach Surf Life Saving Club.

Patrols and Life Saving.

Once again the Club has patrolled Park Beach successfully. I am delighted to report that during the season no life was lost. This fact is doubtless due to the efficiency of patrols.

Forty (40) individual patrols were manned by members in the period December to March. Each patrol was on the beach for an average of $5\frac{3}{4}$ hours. This means that a mammoth total of 1,145 man-hours were spent by the Club members in safeguarding surfers at Park Beach. This, of course, does not include the time spent on essential work such as maintenance of gear and the Club House, training of candidates for examination and the administration of Club affairs.

The Club Captain (Brian Foley) and Vice Captain (Jeff Morley) supervised patrols throughout the season. They were, of course, ably assisted by the seven patrol captains. All are to be complimented on the manner in which the job was done, especially towards the end of the season when the weather did little to encourage the art of natation and when members tended to turn their attention to winter sports.

No rescues were performed during the season, however in considering this fact it would be wise to assess the number of rescues averted by the alertness of patrols in anticipating danger.

The efficiency of patrols is emphasized by our third placing in the State-wide B.P. Patrol Competition. This was consistent with similar high placings in preceding years.

However, to maintain this standard we must adapt ourselves to changing conditions. The Club would be advised to investigate the possibility of illuminating the beach and adjacent waters at night. Many small boats fish in the area on summer evenings and in the event of a mishap an efficient spotlight would be of immense assistance to those performing a rescue. I am certain that the members called by local residents to deal with just this type of situation during the last Christmas holidays will agree on the absolute necessity of a spotlight.

First-Aid.

First-Aid is another of our major public services. Whenever a patrol is on the beach the Club's first-aid equipment is available for immediate use. Frequently members at the Club during non-patrol hours are called upon to administer first-aid.

The Club House phone (which is a major item of expenditure) is doubtless indispensable in cases of serious injury. Whilst our first-aid equipment has proved generally adequate, Club finance has prevented development of these facilities.

The Club Management Committee is now considering the construction of a first-aid room. This would be a most desirable attribute to our present facilities.

Competition.

The Club competed in all but one Carnival held by the Tasmanian State Centre during the season. The State Championships provided pleasing results. Our "A" boat crew, E. McDonald, D. Cole, G. Jacob, P. Lanzlinger and D. Patterson was narrowly beaten by Burnie in one of the most thrilling races of the Carnival. Their second placing was indeed remarkable in view of the fact that the crew was rowing a moulded ply-wood boat for the first season. The theory that the change from a planked boat takes more than a season was completely shattered.

Club House.

The policy of consolidation of amenities in the Clubhouse was continued. The fireplace has proven most popular especially with those who spend week-ends at Park Beach.

State Championships.

The undisputed highlight of our season was the success of the first Tasmanian Championships held in the South. These were conducted on Park Beach on Sunday, 14th February 1965. Members spent many hours preparing for the occasion. Final arrangements were completed on the preceding day. At that time weather and surf conditions were unfavourable. In the afternoon a chilly breeze brought a dull sea mist from the South-east. The surf was flat.

The next morning was magnificent. It was fine, warm and sunny and a big surf was unruffled by a very light northerly breeze. These perfect conditions persisted throughout the day and contributed to the best Tasmanian Championship Carnival in the memory of most officials. Many members will agree that Tasmania will never see a better Surf Life Saving Carnival.

The untiring and unselfish work of our supporters on this day must not go unmentioned. The ladies auxiliary undertook the immense task of feeding all competitors and spectators. The Fathers of members did a sterling job in manning the gates throughout the long hot day

SOCIAL CRICKET MATCH.

At the end of the season we defeated Hobart-Carlton S.L.S.C. at the Sorell cricket ground. The weather was fine and the ground fast.

Carlton batted firm and were subject to a "blistering" pace attack by the Park Beach fast bowlers McDonald and Clarkson. Cole was the first change and his left arm swingers proved almost unplayable in the breezy conditions. He was unlucky not to get more wickets. However, despite this good bowling Carlton hung on to score a formidable 110.

The lunch break was taken between innings and at 1.45 p.m. the Park Beach openers walked nervously to the wicket. Stephenson opened the attack for Carlton and immediately had the batsmen in difficulty. Our supporters were depressed when we lost both openers for only 12 runs. Clarkson and McDonald then came together and after a quiet beginning threw caution to the wind and mastered the confident attack. Eventually Clarkson was out L.B.W. to McKenzie for 18. Cole then came to the wicket and soon was dealing out stiff punishment to the bowlers. His 32 runs were scored in a very short time. During this period McDonald had been providing one of the most lively displays of batting seen at Sorell for many years. In a most polished manner he hooked and drove all bowlers, scoring no less than two sixes and six fours in his score of 43. Added to this were scores of B.Dunkley (11) and C.Woodward (13).

Club Captain's Report.

The 1964-65 season, though continually hampered by bad weather and consequently poor beach crowds, was a successful one for the Park Beach Surf Life Saving Club. Patrols were of a high standard throughout and our competition results commendable - two State Championships coming to Club members. Active membership was considerably increased near the end of the season when eighteen members gained awards at one examination. This was especially commendable as five Instructor's Certificates were among the awards.

No rescues were performed, however, patrols were present at all rostered times as seen by a 100 per cent attendance record. First Aid service was given to the public on numerous occasions.

Club gear has been maintained at a high level, though no large purchases were made. Carnival equipment is the only deficiency in our gear at the moment.

The Club performed well in all Carnivals entered, the culmination being the State Championships at our home beach. The Pembroke Trophy Carnivals were keenly contested with Carlton the overall winner. The Inter Patrol Carnival, held in poor weather conditions, was not as successful as the previous year, though it showed the evenness of our patrol system.
