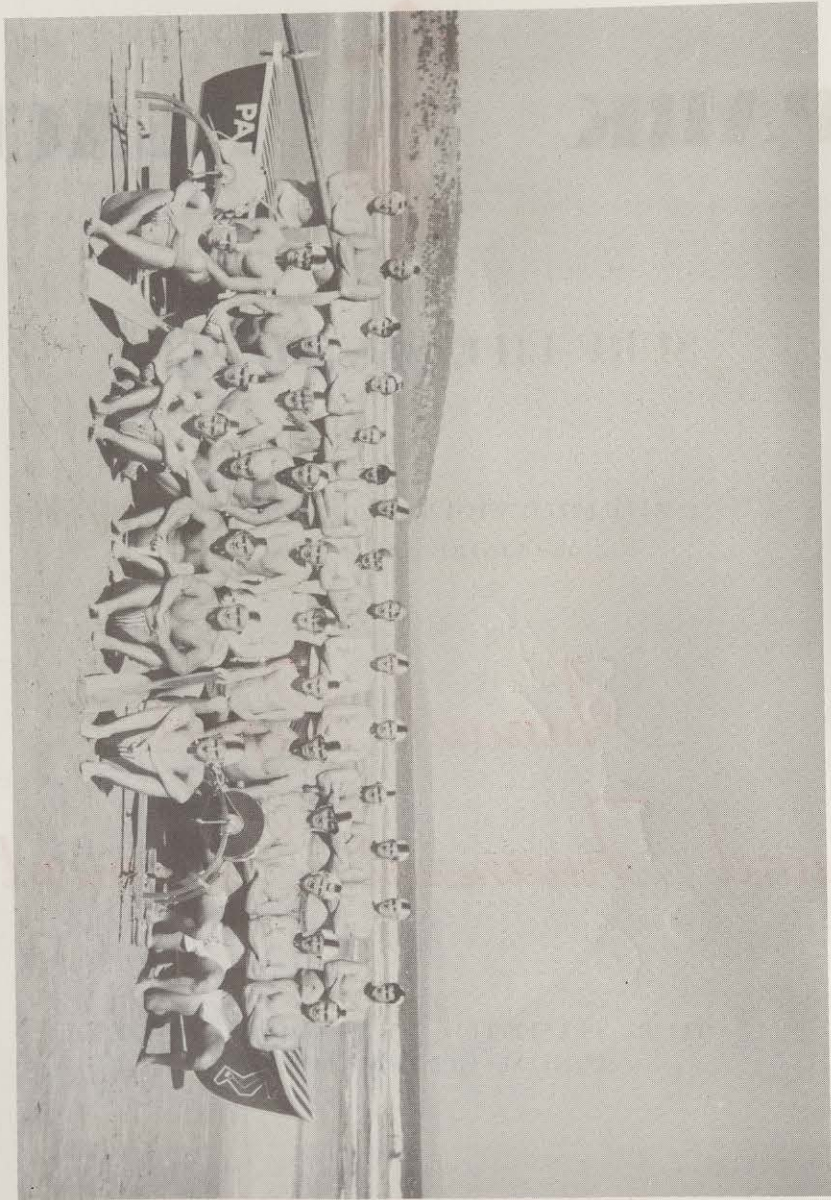

EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT AND FINANCIAL
STATEMENT:

Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is my privilege to place before you, for your perusal and criticism the facts, and figures of the Club for the season just completed.

Although, it appeared that we were in the doldrums, let me assure you that we have been very active and have endeavoured to repay your trust in us by upholding the aims and ideals of the movement at all times.

The past year has been successful in that although we have not reached the greatest heights in competition, we have managed to keep the name of Park Beach well respected in this field.

Generally, the year has been a very harmonious one, the committee not having to use its authority excessively. However, when the occasion arose this body acted to the best of its ability, and I think this has resulted in a greater spirit of teamship existing among Club Members.

With the large influx of new members this season it was found that more sleeping accommodation was required, subsequently the bunk-room was extended, and in the not too distant future will be finished off in the interior, and more bunks provided.

The older members of the Committee proved to be most helpful to the newer recruits, and I am sure it gave them a greater feeling of confidence in carrying out their duties, to have such experienced officers as Brain Foley, Gil. Oakes, Cliff Wright, Mark Ashton, and Eoin McDonald to ask for advice and information.

The Clubhouse is being painted at the present time, but consideration must be given to the environs in the very near future.

PATROLS AND LIFESAVING:

We had to be content this year with third placing in this Competition this year, however, by the standard of the Patrols, I have seen from time to time on the beaches of the two Clubs, which finished in front of us, I feel that we could not have been very far away from winning once again. The inter-Patrol Competition for our own Club Honors, was once again culminated on our annual Captain's Day, (details further on). Several unofficial Patrols were manned during the year due to unusually warm weather attracting large off season crowds. Once again "No Lives Lost", is a tribute to the Club Member's "Vigilance and service". Co-operation between the Surf-Board Riders, and Patrols showed a vast improvement on previous years, and it is quite obvious that the Surf-Board riding fraternity are not going to be the "Thorn in the Side", that I had envisaged earlier.

FIRST AID:

Our First-aid equipment was once again maintained in first-class condition throughout the year and a record number of minor cases were treated. With six qualified First-aiders in the club, we are well equipped in this important aspect of Surf-Lifesaving.
